Calendar Description:

A preparation course for those wishing to enter the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program or wishing to prepare for their NCLEX Certification examination.

Course Description:

This course is designed to prepare students for a variety of situations they will encounter in the NCLEX examination and the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program. This course is not meant to teach nursing but prepare students for real life scenarios they will encounter in the BSN program. Students who wish to prepare for the NCLEX should be coming with nursing experience or a nursing certification in another country. Students may wish to enter into the follow up of this course English for Nursing Communication 2 for a more intensive preparation.

Students will cover topics such as ethics, patient centred care, assessments, disease processes, and an introduction into pharmacology.

Class Profile:

Students must be at an advanced level of learning and can interpret and create complex written and spoken language in a demanding setting within all four areas of competencies. A minimum level of 9 in all four competency areas is required for entering the class.

Educational Objectives:

This course will prepare students for their nursing education in an english speaking setting. Students will:

- 1. Learn English medical terminology for common assessments;
- 2. Assess and monitor a patient in English;
- 3. Develop effective listening strategies and reassure patients;
- 4. Be introduced to language around medication;
- 5. Be introduced to disease processes;
- 6. Learn english involved in ethics for nursing.
