## **Class Description**

Identify their teacher and understand the purpose of the class by the end of the lesson. Students will be able to navigate the online learning platform, moodle. Students will be engaged and talking frequently to peers and teachers throughout the lesson.

## **Enabling Objectives**

Students will be able to communicate with their teachers and ask them questions.

Students will be able to discuss an object given to them with their peers.

Students will be able to set status, answer a poll, turn on camera, turn on mic, use private chat and use shared notes.

Introduction and welcome (10 min)	Teacher A will welcome class and introduce themselves and the course (make sure to mention Alex) Teacher A will go over the agenda for the day. Teacher A will ask the students to turn on their mics and	The students are listening to the agenda.

Moodle overview (5 min)	Teacher B will go over Moodle site and how the teachers will be using it for class. Teacher A will monitor the chat. Speaking activity 1: What's in the Box? (15 min)	Teacher A will introduce the activity and explain	The students each receive a private message containing a word from teacher B. When called on by Teacher A the students turn on their

the rules. Teacher B will privately message each student their object. After 5 minutes Teacher A will call back the students. Teacher A will call on each student to describe their object. Teacher B will monitor chat and who gets it correct. The student who gets the most correct will win.

camera and mic. The student then describes their word while the others guess what it is.

Speaking activity 2: 20 questions (10 min)

Teacher B will introduce the game to the students. Teacher B will pick a place for the students to guess. Teacher A will monitor the chat and who is speaking. Teacher B will give the students 20 guesses for them to figure out where the place is.

Students will ask the teacher questions in the form, "Are you....?". From the answers provided the students will then guess what the place is.

Exit Cards: (3 minutes) What is one topic you would like to discuss in class?

Teacher B will close the class. Teacher B will explain what an exit card is and ask the students the Exit Card guestion.

Students tell the teacher one topic they would like to discuss in class before logging off for the day.

#### **Evaluation/Assessment**

Assessment for this lesson will be informal. The teachers will be observing the students throughout the lesson to better formulate lesson plans that accommodate the learning needs of all students in the class.
